# KRISTIANSAND

## A modern city with charming small-town feel

Kristiansand is a picturesque, coastal hub and the gateway to the scenic highlands with forests, lakes and rivers. Being the capital of Southern Norway, it is known for its floral beauty, culture and traditions - not to forget the "laidback" southern atmosphere. Kristiansand has retained much of its identity from the foundation in 1641, and tends to pleasantly surprise its visitors by easy access to the market square, the fish market and the old town. The residents of Kristiansand are friendly and relaxed, and the quaint city centre is easy to get around, perfect for a one-day stop as there is time to shop, walk around and enjoy some of the highlights.

### ATTRACTIONS/EXCURSIONS

#### Kristiansand Open Air Museum

One of Norway's largest outdoor museums featuring the culture and history of Kristiansand and the county of Vest Agder. Visiting the museum gives you a great introduction to the way of life in olden times in this region.

#### The Cannon Museum

See the world's second largest cannon ever to be mounted on land, dating back to World War II. Batteri Vara is situated in beautiful surroundings by the coast, and a visit gives you great insight to life and work at a cannon battery during the war.

#### The Setesdalsbanen Vintage Railway

Narrow-gauge (1,067 mm) railway powered by a steam engine from 1901. The track section covers 8 km through tunnels, under avalanche shelters, along timber slides and across dams. The trip recreates the special atmosphere of a turn-of-century railway journey.

#### The Arkivet Peace and human rights centre

This building served as a Gestapo regional HQ during the World War II, the basement functioning as a detention and interrogation centre. Arkivet took over the vacated building in 1999. The prison cells and torture chambers from 1942-45 have been reconstructed and installations illustrate the events that took place in the basement

#### Flekkerøy - Fishermen's Island

Visit idyllic Geiterøya (Goat Island) founded on fishing more than 500 years ago. From the days of the sailing ships, fishermen have delivered their catch of the day here. Visit the café for a taste of local delicacies, served with stories from the community. For selfies, take a short walk to the fantastic views of the archipelago and the nearby lighthouse.

#### Explore Kristiansand by Segway

With FLY-N-HI Segway tour you get to see all the highlights of Kristiansand in a fun, easy and effortless way. The tour starts at the pier next to your cruise ship. Our instructors will teach you how to drive the Segway in minutes - with focus on safety.

#### Culinary walk

Join for a culinary walk that takes you to some of the city's most popular places, including the fish market, the city food hall and the nice Teateret café. Indulge yourself with samples of seafood, ice cream, pastry, beer, and apple cider which are some of the treats along the way, all locally produced and prepared.

#### Skudeneset vineyard and basketry

A visit to Skudeneset farm and vineyard offers a glimpse of the good life. Meet a passionate winemaker and his creative wife who have established a fairytale homestead and one of the northernmost vineyards in the world. Learn about the wine making process, stroll along the wine ranks and watch Norwegian wild sheep grazing before heading for a taste of the wine. Don't miss a visit in the basketry and let the winemaker's wife impress you with her willow weaving skills.

#### Archipelago adventures by boat

Explore the coastline of Sørlandet by the sightseeing boat MS Maarten or the schooner SS Christiansand, and sail along picturesque bays and idyllic summer houses. With a bus & boat combo, include a stop in the charming town of Lillesand, before returning by coach to the pier. Or embark on an exciting RIB adventure and go ashore on an island to visit a vantage point with breathtaking view.

#### Hunsfos Craft Brewery Tour

Located in a former paper mill, Hunsfos is small and successful craft brewery. On this tour, we sample their beer together with local snacks. Enjoy the beer and good atmosphere while one of the brewers talks about the brewing process as well as the history of the brewery and the surroundings.

#### The Mineral Park

Visit Europe's finest private collection of minerals displayed in tunnels resembling mining shafts. The shapes of the minerals are a visual pleasure and spellbinding. Even those with no special interest in minerals enjoy the exhibition. The drive to Evje takes you through a region known for significant occurrences of quartz and feldspar. These minerals have been mined for over a century and feldspar is still extracted for use in the production of porcelain.

#### Glowing Golf

Rain or shine, if you know the game or never played mini golf before, Glowing Golf is indoor minigolf the fun way - great fun for all ages. The experience is set in the dark, illuminated by neon backlighting and 3D effects covering the walls and floors of the indoor 18-hole course. Don't be surprised if you find yourself dancing to the music!
